During the academic year 2020-2021 hours would be shared between the two schools as Ada Lovelace is growing in numbers.

The main purpose of the role is to **lead the development of technical and practical support** at Ada Lovelace School and support the Science teaching programme at both Ada Lovelace and William Perkin schools.

We are ideally seeking to appoint a technician for up to 35 hours per week (term time only) however we welcome applicants interested in either **full-time or part-time** positions as hours and role may be negotiable for the right candidate.

**The Twyford Trust**

The Twyford Trust was established in October 2011 to enable an existing School, Twyford CE High School, to build on its successes and look outward to the large number of parents who were eager to become part of its community. The Twyford Trust aims to deliver outstanding education in a comprehensive school setting, and embraces the Twyford School motto 'Life in all its fullness', encouraging students to use their individual gifts wisely and well. Supported by the London Diocesan Board for Schools (LDBS), the Trust is the overarching organisation which provides support for all Trust schools - the Trust comprises four schools in the London Borough of Ealing.

**Ada Lovelace CE High School, Ealing**

Ada Lovelace Church of England High School is a new 6-form-entry local comprehensive school for students aged 11-18. The school opened in September 2018 and had a smaller intake (125 students per year) for two years while co-located at William Perkin CE High School in Greenford. The school moved to its **brand new permanent site** in north Ealing in September 2020, and student numbers have increased to 196 per year group starting with this year's Year 7. The school now has three Year Groups (450 students), and will have 1,330 students when full. Ada Lovelace is named after the Victorian pioneer of computing – the school has a specialism in digital technologies and will provide different routes from Year 7 in ICT and Computer Science as well as applications of Creative Media.

### **William Perkin CE High School**

William Perkin Church of England High School opened as a Free School in September 2013 with its first intake of Year 7 students, and now has seven year groups (7 - 13) totalling almost 1,400 students. The school is founded on the successful systems and approaches of Twyford CE High School, with the principle difference that it is a distinctively Christian school with open admission criteria. The school is rated 'Outstanding' in all areas by Ofsted (June 2015) and SIAMS (October 2016), and is oversubscribed on first choice applicants.
